Vice Commodore's Report

# MERRY CHRISTMAS! SR520 DISRUPTION HEADED OUR WAY IN 2022!

They were delicious...  
I'll explain later.

As you likely know, WSDOT is making significant changes to the 520 bridge. The QCYC 520 Bridge Committee has been working with WSDOT to ensure there is as little disruption to QCYC's members as possible. However, it is inevitable that some of the 520 changes will affect QCYC and its members. Although WSDOT does not know exactly when the work that will affect QCYC will begin, it is our understanding at this time, it may begin in 2022.

Given the most recent (November 2019) information WSDOT has shared with QCYC regarding the work to be performed on the 520 Bridge, and how it may affect our marina, it is likely we will displace all of our work slips and most or all of the boats moored in the 400 series slips. Although we will make every reasonable effort to preserve some manner of moorage for members who are affected by the 520 bridge construction, we are notifying everyone that boats in the

affected slips may be displaced entirely from the QCYC marina when this phase of construction begins.

This is still a very dynamic situation as WSDOT may make additional changes to their plan which may have less, or even more impact, on QCYC. However, since their plan as of November 2019 does require the displacement of most or all of the 400 series slips, we are notifying our members as far in advance as is possible. We will continue to allow moorage movement in the 400 series until it is no longer reasonable, with the strong caveat that any accepted moorage in the 400 series, will require displacement from that moorage at some time. Of course as we the 520 Committee learns more, we will share it with you. So please stay tuned...

Finally, at the December General Meeting, obviously having read my last Bilge Pump article, Vice Commadorable, Denise Lindholme, presented me with eight dozen peanut butter cookies, which she promptly shared with all in attendance. NO, I am hardly at all bitter that Denise shared MY cookies with seemingly everyone. (Ya, I know, "sharing is caring" and all of that) I count my blessings, in part, by the number of cookies I get (Don't you?). I easily had



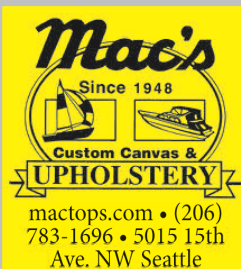
