rentals. The Committee's objective was to analyze the current rental situation and determine if there should be changes or enhancements to how things are currently handled. One major finding was that our current rental fee was somewhat below market value, and that our facility provides a premium venue in comparison to other locations.

The Clubhouse Marketing Committee's recommendation to the Board was that our rental fee be increased from \$605 per event to \$735 per event. At the February Board meeting there was a motion to accept the recommendation, and it was approved by a vote of the Board. This price increase does not affect currently contracted events, but will be effective for events going forward.

For members not currently

aware, the third floor of the clubhouse is available to rent for wedding receptions, graduation parties, birthday parties, etc. so long as the event is sponsored by a member, and does not conflict with a club sponsored event. Additional details and a blank copy of the rental agreement can be found in the Annual.

2016/2017 EVENT CHAIRPERSONS

One of that tasks I am faced with in progressing through the chairs is to ensure that we have chairpersons identified for events and committees in 2016/2017. While many of the people currently serving in those positions, or sponsoring an event will be doing so for another year, there is still a variety of positions in need of volunteers. If you have interest in

learning more about how you can become more involved in QCYC by serving on a committee or sponsoring an event, give me a call or drop me an email. There is no better way to become more engaged with Queen City members than by volunteering.

REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT

Spring is on its way and I am happy to report updates on several improvements at the Mainstation. With joint effort from the Grounds Committee, AAC and Centennial Committee, the Centennial Garden's construction in front of the main entrance will begin soon. This will improve its aesthetic appearance by changing the contours of the existing asphalt to match the footprint of the building. We'll be adding new trees, plants, lighting, irrigation, electrical and a Centennial Monument. The project should be completed by April.

The Board of Trustees has approved the purchase of a new 15' x 30' tent that will be positioned at the "U" at the Mainstation. Delivery is scheduled for early April. The new tent won't extend into the parking lot, which will allow us to maintain our much needed parking stalls. I want to thank Wolfgang Werner for volunteering to chair the Security Committee. Wolfgang has experience prior to his retirement with a similar system as ours at the club.

You should have received an email with three recommendations from the Parking Committee to improve our existing parking policy published in the 2016 Annual. We are looking forward to hearing your thoughts.
