with the Port of Seattle's Bell Street Marina directly a month in advance (by July 7). Tell them you are part of the QCYC group. I will collect the pre-paid \$5 reservation fee from you. Lots to do in downtown Seattle: Pike Place Market (possible tour), shopping, aquarium, galleries, shows, restaurants, possible Mariners' game (vs. Tigers).

★ August 10 Dock Street Marina (Tacoma) – Reserve with the Dock Street Marina directly at least two weeks in advance (by July 27). Possible group dinner at the Spaghetti Factory. Burn off calories with earlier visits to the car museum, state museum, art museum or downtown shopping – all within walking distance.

★ August 11-12 Arabella's Landing (Gig Harbor) – Reserve with Arabella's at least two weeks in advance (by July 27). Gig has a charming downtown with shopping, in addition to a new maritime museum and the Tides Tavern (a destination one evening).

★ August 13-14 Long Branch (Filucy Bay) – Anchor or first come, first-serve dock. If possible, we will schedule a winery tour here.

★ August 15-16 Jarrell Cove State Park – anchor, buoy (under 45'), or first come, first serve dock. There is a marina across from the park that has limited guest moorage and 110. But mostly we're off the grid here. A beautiful state park with lots of great trails and ample room to roam.

We'll have an old fashioned hot dog roast – and, yes, s'mores, in addition to other activities.

★ August 17-18 – Swantown Marina (Olympia) – Reserve with the marina at least a month in advance (by July 16). I will collect the pre-paid \$5 reservation fee from you. We'll be able to visit the farmer's market while here and will have dinner out one night and a barbecue another night.

★ August 19 Des Moines – Des Moines Marina - Make reservations with Des Moines. Des Moines typically has the lowest fuel prices around. They also have a neat park (bocci ball, anyone?) and an Anthony's for a possible "farewell" dinner.

## WEBSITE-BASED WORK SLIP RESERVATION SYSTEM

The past process of scheduling a work slip via the paper calendar in the QCYC deck two galley has been replaced with an on-line version found on the QCYC web site. As of your receipt of this message, all existing reservations have been transposed to the web site and the paper calendar is removed. Follow the below steps to place a work slip reservation,

1. Sign into [QCYC.ORG](http://QCYC.ORG) via your member log in and password.
2. On the navigation bar at the top of the screen, click on **FACILITES** and select **WORK SLIP RESERVATION** from the drop down menu.

3. Review the available dates and proceed to the lower portion of the screen
4. Select the requested work slip, enter your name, enter boat name.
5. Select **START DATE** and **END DATE** via the pop up calendars activated by clicking in the blocks. Time adjustments beyond the defaults need to be typed in. Reservations are limited to two calendar days.
6. At the bottom of the screen click **RESERVE** to secure your reservation. A message will appear at the top of the page if there's a conflict or problem. Otherwise, you'll see a new screen confirming your reservation, which will be simultaneously posted to the calendar.

a reservation if you decide not to use it. You can do so by clicking on your **NAME** on the reservation found on the calendar, click **EDIT**, then click **DELETE** at the right side of the page. You can also follow the same steps to amend reservations dates and click **SAVE** upon completion.

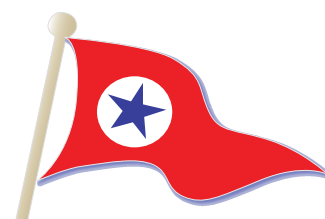

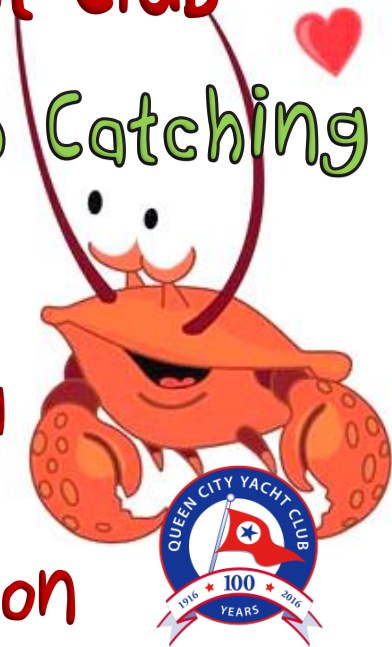
